The American Legion Preamble has been the beacon light of The American Legion for almost 100 years. It has been amended only once in all that time. That amendment consisted of adding the letter "S" to the word "war." It makes the Preamble read today "Great Wars," so as to embrace all wars.

"For God and Country, we associate ourselves together for the following purposes:

To uphold and defend the Constitution of the United States of America; to maintain law and order; to foster and perpetuate a 100-percent Americanism; to preserve the memories and incidents of our associations in the great wars; to inculcate a sense of individual obligation to the community, state and nation; to combat the autocracy of both the classes and the masses; to make right the master of might; to promote peace and good will on earth; to safeguard and transmit to posterity the principles of justice,

freedom and democracy; to consecrate and sanctify our comradeship by our devotion to mutual helpfulness

All of the youth-training programs of The American Legion are built on this ideal of safeguarding and transmitting to posterity the principles of justice, freedom, and democracy. All Americans can be proud that in our international relations we have tried to live by the golden rule, the mark of justice. We have granted to others, as we prize it ourselves, the great boon of freedom. Through the Monroe Doctrine, we call a halt to foreign imperialism in the Western Hemisphere. We gave freedom to the Philippines. These principles are part of the American heritage. Legionnaires are pledged to protect and preserve that heritage

Reminder, the American Legion is only as strong as its membership base. The more devoted members it has, the better the organization can advocate for veterans and serve the military community which has given much to our country. Invite a potential member to our meetings.

One of the four pillars the American Legion stands on is Americanism. This is the Pillar that is closest to my heart. What is Americanism? "Americanism is the love of America; loyalty to her institutions as the best yet devised by man to secure life, liberty, individual dignity, and happiness; and the willingness to defend our country and flag against all enemies, foreign and domestic.

It is a vital, active, living force. Americanism means peace, strength, the will and the courage to live as



free men in a free land. It means a friendly hand to people everywhere who respect our institutions and our thinking. It is not a word, it is a cause, a way of life – the best way of life ever known – a challenge and a hope in this world.



Americanism is an ideal of loyal patriotism, religious tolerance, righteous freedom, fearless courage, honest integrity, abiding faith in the commanding destiny of the United States, and a fathomless love for the principles that led our forefathers to found this country. It is complete and unqualified loyalty to the ideals of government as set forth in the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution of the United States. It is respect for, and ready obedience to, duly constituted authority and the laws of the land. It is freedom without license, religion without bigotry, charity without bias, and a desire to secure the blessings

of liberty for our nation and for our posterity."

There are many programs in the American Legion that are under the Americanism pillar. Some of them are Boys/Girls State, the Oratorical Contest which is coming up soon, shooting sports for the youth - and there has been some interest in this - and coming up this month is the flag retirement ceremony. Thanks for all the help. I encourage everyone to support these programs because they help build patriotism, knowledge and love for the Constitution of the United States, and integrity in the youth of our community.

POW/MIA News

Half a century has passed since the Vietnam War. Commemoration of that endeavor extends from Memorial Day 2012 through Veterans Day 2025. One of the significant activities this year was the distribution of 47,000 copies of the book 'A time to Honor' and the accompanying video documentary 'The Journey Home' to Utah Vietnam Veterans. Thanks to Sharlene Hawkes President of Remember My Service Productions and to many, many contributing sponsors.

Vietnam Veterans who have not received their copy may contact the Utah Department of Veterans Affairs. An expanded e-book version containing the stories of over 200 Utah Vietnam veterans is available. To request access to this file go to http://www.vietnam50gift.com/ebook-download.

Congress articulated five objectives for the 50th commemoration. The first objective is "To thank and honor veterans of the Vietnam War, including personnel who were held as prisoners of war, or listed as missing in action, for their service and sacrifice on behalf of the United States and to thank and honor the families of these veterans."

Nine million Americans served on active duty in the U.S. Armed Forces during the period of the Vietnam War: approximately 7 million were living in 2015. At the dedication of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in 1982, there were **57,939 names** inscribed on the Memorial. As of Memorial Day 2015, there are **58,307** names. These are names of military personnel who were wounded in Vietnam between 1957 and



1975 and ultimately died of their wounds. (1959 and 1975 are the years inscribed on The Wall. In 1973 there were 2,646 United States service members and civilians missing in action. Today more than 1,600 Americans remain accounted for from the conflict. Six hundred sixty two American POWs got out of Vietnam alive in 1973. I was excited to be one of them. As of January 2016, 183 have flown West.
