THAT KNOWING LOOK

I was up at the VA Hospital to pick up some medication to treat my Agent Orange-induced diabetes. As I sat in the waiting room while my prescription was being prepared, I had a chance to watch the vast variety of veterans who frequent the place. They represented many stages of personal health – some hobbling along with the help of a cane or some who were ambulatory only because of a wheelchair or scooter. All of them, like me, looked pretty well used. Many of us sported ball

caps, proudly displaying our service branch or the war in which we served. But now here is the interesting part: though none of us knew each other, an immediate bond was recognized.



That knowing look that says "been there, done that" and I know you have too, is introduction enough. It says "I speak your language and I get it." There is a silent signal that allows us both to know that even though we've never met, we have both shared an experience that no

civilian will ever understand. It doesn't matter which war or wars we have seen – World War II, Korea, Vietnam, Granada, or Iraq or Afghanistan – that experience and its attendant "knowing look" bridges all wars.

Now this brings me to my point: that "knowing look," that shared experience and that special brotherhood always lifts my spirits and validates my service. And the place that I find these feelings most is when I am among the men and women of Post 27. Aaron was presented a lapel pin for his participation, first place check of \$150. and the Gold Medal for 1st place.

American Legion Utah Boys State. On-line registration for American Legion Utah Boys State 2018 opened December 1, 2017 and will remain open through April 30, 2018. Registration for the 2018 Program will be electronic only. Utah Boys State has been working with the IT people at Weber State University for the last several years and the application process has been improved and refined each year. The electronic application can be found at www.weber.edu/utahboysstate. Completion of the registration

package is self- guided and straight forward. When the online application has been completed / approved, the student citizen must print off the completed application package (hard copy). Two additional steps are required to complete enrollment. The high school Counselor must certify current GPA and make comments concerning students interest in the program; and Post 27 must interview /comment on student citizens interest / desire to complete this program which earns them 3 college credits in Political Science. Once all steps have been completed applicants must follow the instructions below.

All completed applications must be received, to include family insurance card(s) and tuition of \$375.00 by May 15th,

2018. Completed packages should be mailed to American Legion Utah Boys State, Post Office Box 783, Clearfield, Utah 84089-0783.

How can you help? 1. Help with the interviews at the four high schools Post 27 supports. 2. Volunteer June 10-15, 2018 at Weber State University as a faculty counselor for one of the 10-12 "cities" with its student citizens. The staff course curriculum is provided. All meals and housing are provided free. Police officers, firefighters and first responders, Legionnaires, Sons of the American Legion, and Boys State graduates may all volunteer. Sons of the American Legion

I have been asked by several people about what it takes to be a member of the Sons of the American Legion. (SAL). The following should answer all of your questions.

All male descendants, adopted sons and stepsons of members of The American Legion, and such male descendants of veterans who died in service during World I, World War II, the Korean War, the Vietnam War, Lebanon, Grenada, Panama, the Persian Gulf War and the War on Terrorism, during the delimiting periods set forth In Article IV, Section 1,

of the National Constitution of The American Legion, or who died subsequent to their honorable discharge from such service, shall be eligible for membership in the Sons of The American Legion.

There shall be no forms or class of membership except an active membership.

Are girls or women eligible to join the Sons?

No. Only males are eligible to join the Sons. Women who are veterans and are eligible to join The American Legion are welcome and encouraged to do so. The American Legion Auxiliary was established to provide Legion Family membership for immediate family female relatives of Legionnaires and/or war-time veterans.

How can I sign up for the Sons?

You should check with someone at The American Legion Post nearest you. There is a good chance that Post will have its own Squadron of the Sons. If not, someone at the Post should be able to tell you where to find a Squadron near you. If not, contact the S.A.L. National Headquarters for information about finding a nearby Squadron.

I am a member of The American Legion. Can I also belong to the Sons?

Maybe. Many veterans who are eligible for membership in The American Legion are also eligible to join the Sons if he had a father/mother, grandfather/grandmother, great grandfather/ great grandmother serve during a war period as listed with

The American Legion. They are very much welcome to belong to both organizations. We call these individuals dual members. They are quite often an important link between the Sons and The Legion Post in their home towns.

How much does it cost to belong to the Sons?

Each Squadron establishes its dues requirements. Squadron 27 dues are \$10.00 annually. Generally speaking, annual dues normally run between \$10 and \$30. We have a slogan within the Sons which addresses the issue of dues: It's not the price you pay for membership...it's the price your forefathers paid to make you eligible!"

I am moving to a new town and want to transfer my membership there. How do I get a new card?

Be sure to report your new address. You can do that in person through your new Squadron Adjutant, or you can do it electronically by going to The Legion's Web site and filling out an electronic form.

Can an S.A.L. member sign up a new Legion member and vice versa?

Yes! The same applies to Auxiliary membership. As long as the necessary membership application is filled out and the prospective member provides a copy of his/her DD-214 discharge papers (this applies to Legion membership...prospective S.A.L. and Auxiliary members need to supply a copy of discharge papers for the relative through whom their eligibility is established) and they pay the appropriate amount for dues, simply submit these materials to the Legion or S.A.L. Adjutant. In fact...many members of the Sons like to carry around blank copies of membership applications for each of the Legion Family organizations, just in case.

The <u>pownetwork.org</u> was founded by Chuck and Mary Schantag of Branson, Missouri on 11/11/89. These two are dedicated to information distribution on our Prisoners of War and Missing in Action Servicemen. Mary has valiantly carried the task alone since Chucks passing in 2012. They are loved and greatly appreciated friends of most of the 400+ living of 591 returned POWs of the Vietnam War.



Quotes from their web page are revealing. "You are not forgotten! Be the one that remembers! Somebody didn't do something about this – then I realized I

Jay C. Hess AM SOMEBODY. 'Til the job is done and they're all home. When one American is not worth the effort to be found, we as Americans have lost."

The **POW NETWORK** was named the "Association of the Year" by the Red River Valley Fighter Pilots Assn in 2005, received the "True American Hero Award" in 2006 and the "Endurance/Lifetime Commitment Award in 2013.

The vast amount of information about Prisoners Of War and Missing In Action distributed by this organization is easily accessed under the headings of POW/MIA Issues, The Fake Warrior Project or their custom search capability. The date and coordinates of my shoot down can be found by entering "Jay" in the search box.

<u>www.pownetwork.org</u> is a recommended source of information. There are others. Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency (DPAA) <u>www.dpaa.mil</u> has been mentioned previously.
