Armed Forces Day: This day may not be highlighted on many calendars, but for us, it is of significance and may present an opportunity to educate family members and neighbors. It is held annually on the third Saturday of May, this year on Saturday, May 16th. Many of us may not have been thanked during the time of our service owing to the national sentiment then. Today those sentiments have changed. As opportunity presents itself, please take a moment to thank and recognize those men and women who are currently serving in the armed forces in the United States. We can also clarify for others that Veterans Day honors all those who have previously served in the military. As well as Memorial Day, when we honor those men and women who have died while serving in the United States Armed Forces.



Memorial Day: For a number of years now, Post 27 has participated in the observance of Memorial Day. Members of the Post are invited to come to participate in the placement of more than 400 federal flags on veterans' grave at the Farmington City Cemetery on Friday, May 22 at 8:00 am. Bring a long screwdriver for starting a hole in the ground for placing the flags. We will be working in two-person teams, being careful to observe safe distancing throughout this process.

Also on May 22, Post 27 members are invited to assist with the placement of more than 1,000 flags at the Kaysville Cemetery. The event will begin at 10:30 am. In past years, Post 27 members have teamed up with

Kaysville City holding a program at the cemetery on Monday morning of Memorial Day. This year Kaysville City has canceled this event owing to the COVID-19 pandemic. Post 27 will honor their choice. In recent years Post 27 has held its own Memorial Day Program at 12 noon at the Farmington City Cemetery. We are planning to do so again this year, contingent upon Utah State Government guidelines for public gatherings. Put it on your calendar for starting at 12 noon.

Memorial Day (previously, but now seldom called **Decoration Day**) is a federal holiday in the United States for remembering, honoring, and mourning the military personnel that had died while serving in the United States Armed Forces. The name "Memorial Day", which was first used in 1882, gradually became more common than "Decoration Day" after World War II but was not declared the official name by federal law until 1967. The holiday is now observed on the last Monday of May, Memorial Day having been observed on May 30 from 1868 to 1970.

On Memorial Day, the flag of the United States is raised briskly to the top of the staff and then solemnly lowered to the half-staff position, where it remains only until noon. It is then raised to full-staff for the remainder of the day.



In 1915, following the Second Battle of Ypres, Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae, a physician with the Canadian Expeditionary Force, wrote the poem, "In Flanders Fields". Its opening lines refer to the fields of **poppies** that grew among the soldiers' graves in Flanders. In 1920, the National American Legion adopted it as their official symbol of remembrance. May 22, 2020 is National Poppy Day. Wear a poppy!

May we all take time this Memorial Day to remember, honor and give thanks to God for those who have given the ultimate sacrifice to preserve the freedoms we enjoy today.



World War II: The Battle for Castle Itter

Quite possibly one of the most bizarre battles of World War II, this legendary battle involved 14 American soldiers, a Yugoslavian resistance member, 10 German Wehrmacht troops, an SS Officer, one tank and a handful of French prisoners working *together* to fight off roughly 150 Nazi SS soldiers from taking over a recently-liberated castle in Austria.

On May 3rd of 1945, a Yugoslav resistance member was handed a letter written in English and told to hand it to the first American he saw. Covering more than 40 miles, he ran into the American 409th Infantry Regiment, who organized a rescue party to go take the castle and liberate the French prisoners inside.

While an entire unit of armor was supposed to go on the operation, artillery fire held back all but two jeeps of infantrymen, which made their way to the castle. Before their arrival, the German skeleton crew that were tasked with guarding the castle fled, leaving the

French prisoners -including Charles de Gaulle's sister and a French tennis star- to gather up whatever weapons remained and defend their "accommodations" until Allied forces arrived.

In addition to the two jeeps of American troops, a small group of German soldiers who pledged to protect a nearby village against brutal SS reprisals heard about what was happening at the castle and moved in to assist. At the same time, a single Sherman tank of the 12th Armored Division under the command of Captain "Jack" Lee heard about the castle as well, darting off to make history or get blown up, whichever came first.

Angry about losing face and still fanatically dedicated to the Nazi cause, SS units moved in to take the castle back. Left with no option but to defend, the ragtag band of castle defenders fought viciously through the night to drive off the SS. During the battle, the American tank was taken out by an 88mm gun, though none of the Sherman crew were killed.

By early afternoon of the second day, word of some crazy stuff going down at ol' Itter reached the 142nd, prompting the unit to race to the Austrian castle. On the way, they ran into the French tennis star Jean Borotra, who had bravely vaulted the castle wall and dashed through SS troops to relay the situation to the Americans. His task complete, he requested a uniform



and joined the 142nd in backing up the besieged coalition at Itter.

Arriving around 4:00 pm, the Americans swiftly defeated the SS, taking around a hundred prisoners. Two days later, Germany surrendered.

To get there, go to ALAForVeterans.org > LOG IN > click on MEMBERS ONLY on the top bar. When that is open, click on ALA ACADEMY > click on ALA 101. It should only take 30~40 minutes to complete. In this same area, there are many other on-line courses that may interest you and increase your knowledge about the American Legion Auxiliary.

Another area of interest with this website: MEMBERS ONLY > click on at the bottom of the list where you found the ALA 101, click on ALA Service Not Self Volunteering Toolkit. There are great ideas for our group as individuals and as a group for volunteering. Keep track of your volunteer hours by project and any miles driven. Volunteer time includes travel time. These should be reported to me as the Unit President monthly. This report goes to National annually, and is part of the big report from The American Legion that goes to Congress. <u>Legion & Unit Report from Down Under</u>

Anzac Day is a national day of remembrance in Australia and New Zealand that broadly commemorates all Australians and New Zealanders "who served and died in all wars, conflicts, and peacekeeping operations" and "the contribution and suffering of all those who have served." The April 25 date recalls the 1915 Battle of Gallipoli in which many Australians and New Zealanders fell. 
