Project Operation Verify. The IRS requires American Legion Posts to maintain dates of service and character of service records for all members. The penalty for not having the required proof of eligibility can be \$1,000 per day. (*The American Legion Dispatch – August 2013*). Post 27 Members – it is time for those members who have not submitted some form of service documentation to do so at the earliest opportunity. We currently have only 23% of our members who have submitted service documentation. Please take some time and dig through those old service records and provide either a DD-214 or Discharge Certificate. You may redact any information on the form other that dates and character of service. They are scanned to a "thumb drive" and the original is placed in a safe.



What's the point? On March 9, 1906, Congress authorized furnishing headstones for the graves of Confederate soldiers buried in national cemeteries as well as in Confederate burial plots. Congress specified that the headstones be fashioned in the same size and of the same material as those of Union soldiers and of U.S. soldiers who had died in the Spanish-American War. There was to be one difference, however. Whereas U.S. headstones were rounded at the top, the Confederate design was pointed. Immediately, a story was circulated that one of the Confederate veterans consulted on the design of the headstones declared, "We don't want any damn Yankee sitting on our tombstones." The story stuck and is



still widely offered up as the explanation for the difference between Yankee and Rebel military headstones. There is, however, no evidence that the tale is true. More likely, it was just deemed appropriate to make some simple distinction between Union and Confederate graves. A change in shape was a way to do this without necessitating the use of different materials.

THE AMERICAN LEGION NATIONAL CONVENTION REPORT

Houston was hot and humid (expected), cooler, overcast weather for the Legion parade through the streets of Houston (not expected); all locals were extremely friendly and helpful (not expected), Utah made an impact (expected); had fun and learned a lot (hoped for). Chuck and Paula Stephenson from Post 27 attended as delegates for the Department of Utah, along with 14 other delegates from Utah.



The impact Utah made was striking, compared to the past three years that I have attended.

1. Utah presented a resolution which was approved and The American Legion will sponsor support for national legislation in establishing the higher deductible mileage allowance of 55.5 cents per mile driven for members involved in their program and community activities.

2. Utah was #5 of 16 Departments that met or exceeded its membership goal of 100 percent or better. We attained 101.455 percent of our goal, reaching 7,181 American Legion members in Utah.

3. We reached all of our target dates throughout the year, including the Early Bird target dates—award presented.

4. The Department of Utah Commander Bill Dunlap won "Commander of the Year" for Membership. With all that we attained above, Utah was seated three rows from the main state; normally we are in the back of the convention hall.
5. Bill Christoffersen, Utah's National Executive Committeeman for 50+ years (only Legionnaire/state to accomplish this longevity) retired as NEC. The bottom line--well done Utah!! *The best in the West!*
